Political System

Ukraine is a sovereign, independent, democratic, social and legal state.

Ukraine is a Republic. Ukraine's people represent the sovereignty and the unified source of power in the country. People execute power directly as well as through state authorities and local self-administration offices.

State power in Ukraine is exercised on the basis of its legislative, executive and judicial branches.

Ukraine's Constitution has supreme judicial power.

The President of Ukraine is the Head of the State and speaks on behalf of its name¹. He is selected by citizens of Ukraine on the basis of the common, equal and direct suffrage by ballot for the period of five years and no more than for two terms successively.

The legislative branch consists of a one-chamber Parliament – the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine. Executive power is carried out by the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine.

Political parties and public organizations take active part in the creation of the democratic state. They are the source of innovation and social and political technologies suggested to the society. They also act as guarantors of the democratic development of Ukraine's state.

In Ukraine there are 172 political parties and 3,108 public organizations with international and all-Ukrainian status.

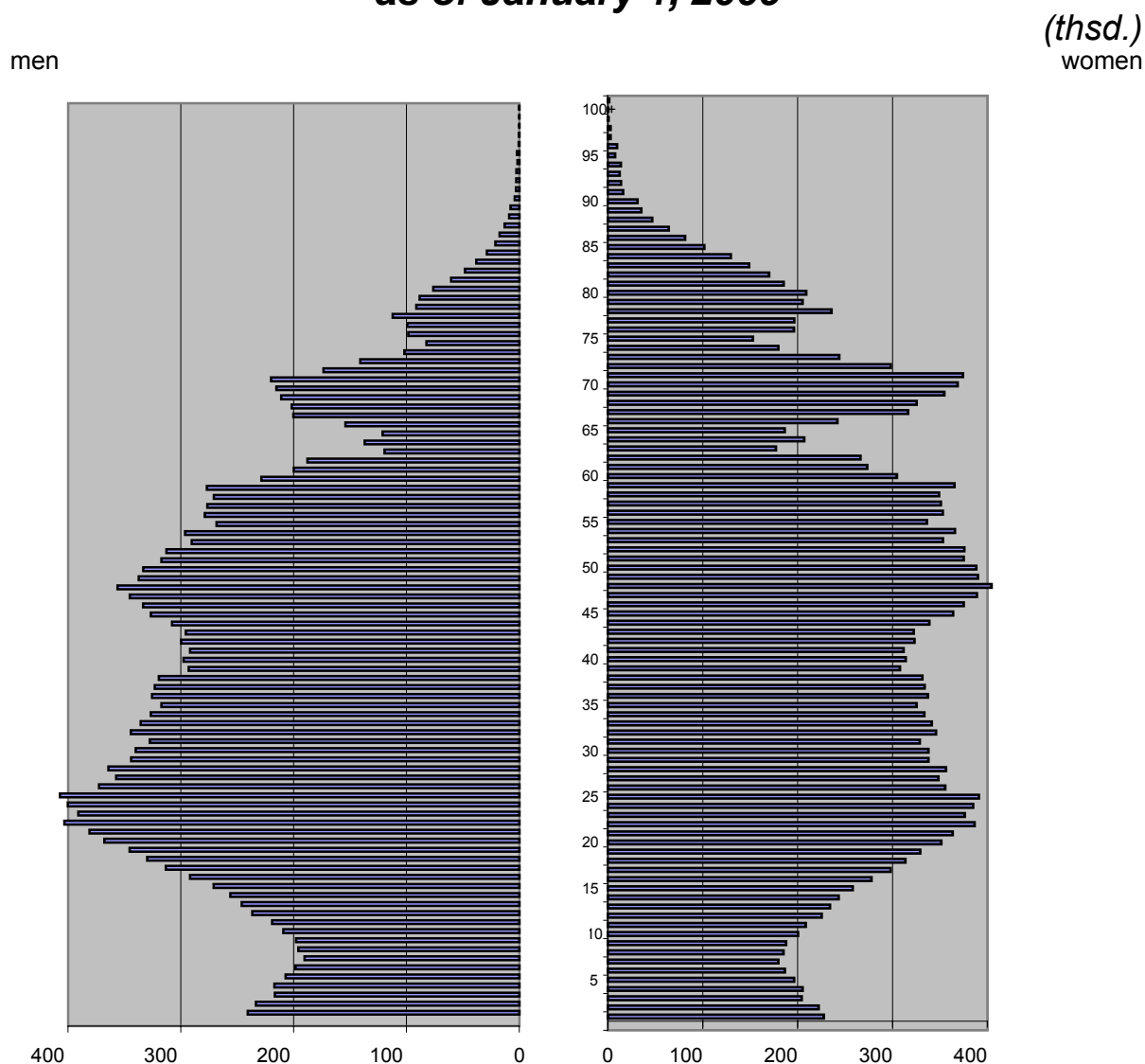

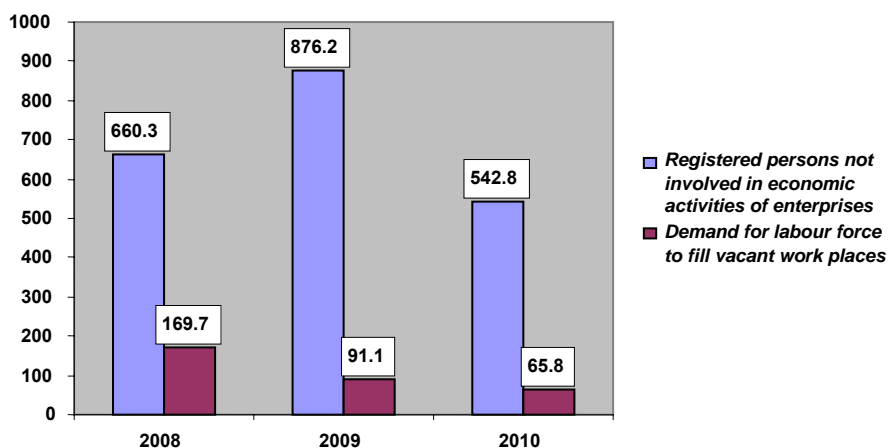

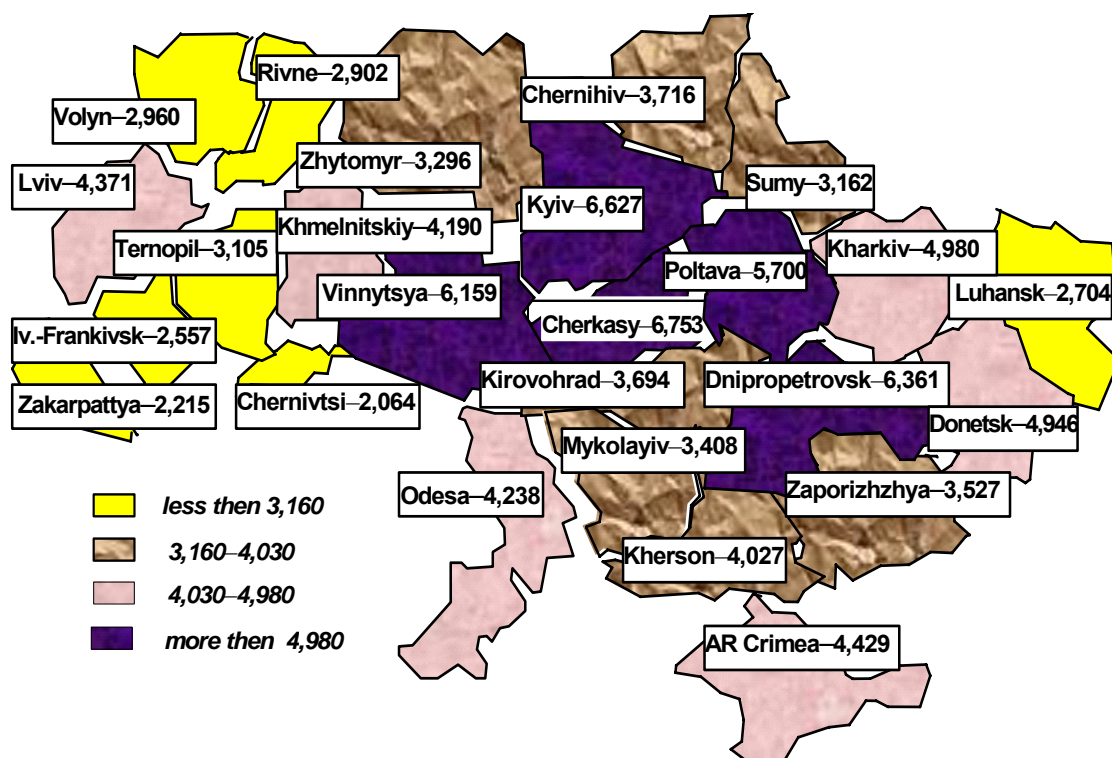

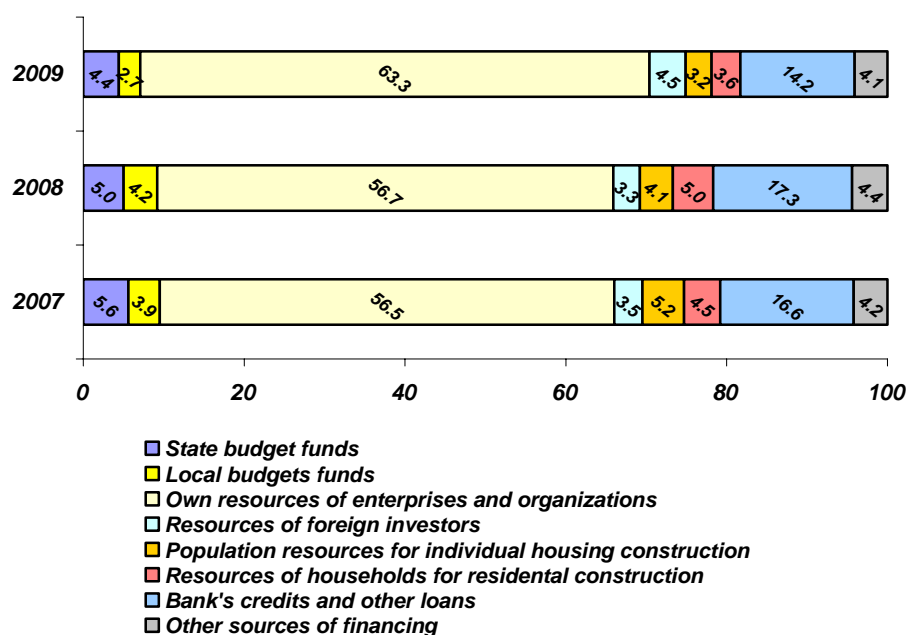

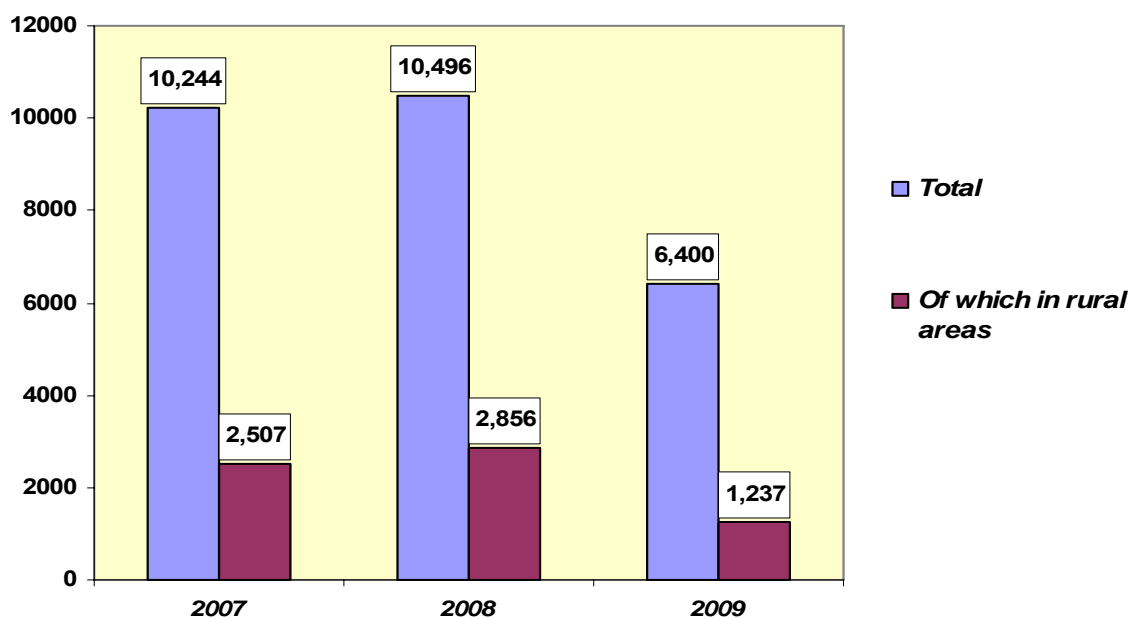
Structure of Fixed Capital Investment, by Sources of Financing

The favorable geographical position of Ukraine amidst basic transit streams connecting Europe and Asia, the availability of the ice-free Black Sea ports, the advanced network of motor roads and railways, and pipelines create all necessary conditions for increase in transit of cargoes. In 2009, 337.0 mln.t of transit cargoes passed through territory of Ukraine consisting mainly of energy materials, oil and products of its distillation, bituminous materials and mineral wax (87.6% of the total transportation). Among types of transport, the leading part is played by pipeline (79.5% of total transit) and railway (18.9%) transport.

The **air space** of Ukraine is actively used. The annual quantity of transit flights of planes of foreign airlines for the last five years has increased more than by 30%.

In 2009, the regular international flights were made by 6 Ukrainian air companies: partnership Airlines with Air Ukraine, closed joint-stock partnership air company *Aerosvit*, open joint-stock partnership Air Company *Dniproavia*, partnership Air Company *Donbasaero*, closed joint-stock partnership Air Company International Lines of Ukraine, partnership Air Company *Rosa Vitriv* and partnership Ukrainian Mediterranean Air Lines. The direct air routes with Kyiv connected 11 cities of Ukraine, the regular international flights to the capital of Ukraine were made by 44 foreign air companies.

Among the services rendered by Ukraine to other countries of the world in 2009, the greatest share is made up by **transport services** – 65.7% (6.3 bln. USD), of which 33.4% pipeline, 19.7% railway, 20.2% sea and 17.6% air transport.

In 2009, the trading and fish ports, and the industrial wharfs (sea and river) of Ukraine have processed 162.0 mln.t of cargo. Within cargo traffic that comes through the Ukrainian ports (wharfs), exports cargo (55.3%) and transit cargo (32.3%) prevail. Sea and river ports (wharfs) render services to about 25.3 thsd. vessels, 17.0 thsd. of them are of foreign origin and vessels belonging to foreign carriers.

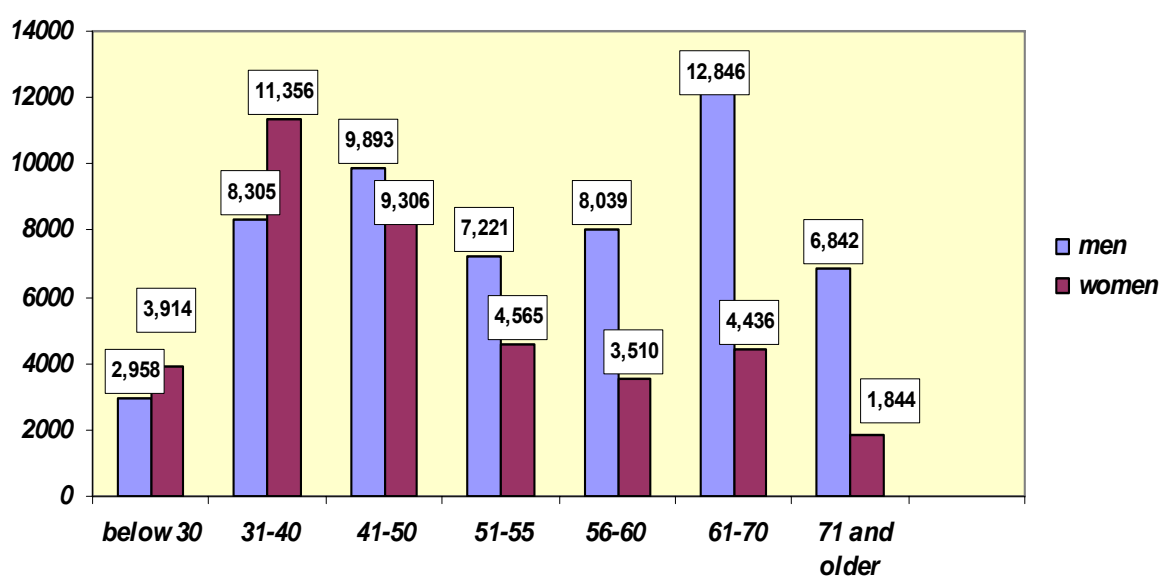
