






Expected changes of industrial production over the next 3 months (seasonal adjustment)






Assessment of current stock of finished products in industry

(seasonal adjustment)




Assessment of industrial production in the past 3 months

(seasonal adjustment)




Assessment of current export order-books (export demand) on the industrial production




Expected changes in selling prices for the products of industry over the next 3 months




Expected changes in employment at industrial enterprises over the next 3 months (seasonal adjustment)




Availability of orders to industrial enterprises
